

# 5 Day Devotional

## Day 1: When Pain Becomes Purpose

### Devotional

Have you ever wondered why God allows difficult seasons in your life? Sometimes the very thing that feels like it's destroying us becomes the catalyst for something beautiful. When Stephen was martyred and persecution broke out against the early church, it seemed like the end of everything they had worked for. But God had a different plan.

The believers who were scattered didn't retreat in defeat - they became missionaries wherever they went. Their pain became their platform for sharing the gospel. What looked like destruction was actually God's way of spreading His love to new places and new people.

Maybe you're in a season right now where everything feels upside down. Perhaps you're facing loss, disappointment, or circumstances that don't make sense. Remember that God specializes in using our most painful moments for His greatest purposes. He hasn't abandoned you in your struggle - He's preparing you for something greater.

Your current pain isn't the end of your story. It's the beginning of a testimony that will encourage others and bring glory to God. Trust that He's working even when you can't see it.

### Bible Verse

'On that day a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria.' - Acts 8:1

### Reflection Question

How might God be preparing to use your current struggles or past pain as a testimony to encourage others and spread His love?

### Quote

Only God can use suffering to bring about salvation. Only God can do things like that.

### Prayer

Lord, help me trust that You can transform my pain into purpose. When I don't understand what You're doing, give me faith to believe that You're working all things together for good. Use my story to encourage others and bring glory to Your name. Amen.

## Day 2: Moving Forward in Faith

### Devotional

Faith isn't about having all the answers - it's about taking the next step even when the path isn't clear. When the early believers were scattered by persecution, they didn't have a detailed mission strategy or a comfortable plan. They simply went where God led them and shared the gospel as they lived their lives.

This is how real faith works. It's not about waiting until everything makes perfect sense or until we feel completely ready. It's about moving forward with what we know to be true about God's character and His promises. When we step out in faith, even in small ways, God's power is displayed in our lives.

You don't have to have everything figured out to be used by God. You don't need to be perfect or have all your problems solved. What you need is a willingness to trust God with the next step. Whether you're facing a major life decision or simply trying to live faithfully in your daily routine, God wants to show His power through your obedience.

Take that step of faith today. Trust that where God leads you, He will empower you to do His work.

### **Bible Verse**

'But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' - Acts 1:8

### **Reflection Question**

What step of faith is God calling you to take today, even if you don't have all the details worked out?

### **Quote**

God's power, listen is displayed in my life as I move forward in faith.

### **Prayer**

Father, give me courage to move forward in faith even when I can't see the whole picture. Help me trust that Your power will be displayed as I step out in obedience. Fill me with Your Holy Spirit and use me as Your witness wherever You lead me. Amen.

## **Day 3: Sharing as You Go**

### **Devotional**

One of the most beautiful truths about the early church is that they didn't wait for a formal missionary program to share the gospel. As they were scattered by persecution, they naturally shared what Jesus had done in their lives wherever they went. They understood that being a missionary isn't about having a special title or going to a foreign country - it's about sharing God's love in the ordinary moments of life.

You are a missionary right where you are. Whether you're at work, school, the grocery store, or talking with neighbors, you have opportunities to be a witness for Christ. It's not about having all the right words or being a perfect Christian. It's about authentically sharing how God has worked in your life and showing His love through your actions.

The gospel was always meant to spread cross-culturally and geographically, but it starts with you being faithful in your everyday relationships. God wants to use your life - your conversations, your kindness, your testimony - to reach people who need to know His love.

Don't wait for the perfect opportunity or until you feel more qualified. Start sharing as you go, trusting that God will use your faithfulness in ways you may never fully see.

### **Bible Verse**

'Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went.' - Acts 8:4

## **Reflection Question**

Who in your daily life might God be calling you to share His love with through your words or actions?

## **Quote**

You and I are missionaries as you go share the gospel as you live your life, as you go to the bank, as you deal with the store, as you talk with your neighbors.

## **Prayer**

Lord, help me see the missionary opportunities in my everyday life. Give me boldness to share Your love naturally as I go about my day. Use my testimony and my actions to point others to You. Make me faithful in the small moments. Amen.

# **Day 4: Breaking Down Barriers**

## **Devotional**

When Philip went to Samaria, he was crossing significant cultural and religious boundaries. Jews and Samaritans had centuries of hostility between them, yet Philip preached Christ with remarkable success. The gospel has the power to break down walls that seem impossible to overcome - walls of race, culture, past hurts, and personal prejudices.

Maybe there are people in your life who seem unreachable. Perhaps there are relationships that feel too broken to repair or cultural differences that seem too great to bridge. The gospel reminds us that no barrier is too high for God's love to overcome. His grace can heal the deepest wounds and unite the most unlikely people.

God may be calling you to step outside your comfort zone and reach out to someone who is different from you. It might be someone from a different background, someone who has hurt you, or someone you've written off as unreachable. The same gospel that changed your heart can change theirs too.

Don't let past hurts or cultural differences keep you from sharing God's love. Trust that the gospel is powerful enough to bridge any division and heal any hostility.

## **Bible Verse**

'Philip went down to a city in Samaria and proclaimed the Messiah there.' - Acts 8:5

## **Reflection Question**

What barriers - cultural, personal, or relational - might God be calling you to cross in order to share His love with someone?

## **Quote**

The only solution for the sinful heart of men is the gospel of Jesus Christ. It's the only thing that can bridge that division and heal that hostility.

## **Prayer**

God, help me see beyond the barriers that divide people. Give me Your heart for those who are different from me or who have hurt me. Use me to share Your love that breaks down walls and heals divisions. Make me an instrument of Your peace. Amen.

# **Day 5: Heart Check and Surrender**

## **Devotional**

Simon the sorcerer's story serves as a sobering reminder that it's possible to be around spiritual things without having a genuine relationship with God. He was amazed by the miracles and even believed, but his heart was still focused on personal gain and power. When he tried to buy spiritual authority, Peter confronted him about the bitterness and bondage in his heart.

This challenges us to examine our own hearts regularly. Are we pursuing God for who He is, or for what He can do for us? Are we serving Him out of love, or are we trying to use our faith for personal advancement? It's easy to get caught up in religious activities while missing the heart of what God desires - genuine surrender and authentic relationship.

When bitterness, pride, or selfish ambition creeps into our hearts, we need to run to the cross. Just as Moses threw a tree into bitter water to make it sweet, the cross of Christ can transform the bitter places in our hearts. God wants to fill us with His Holy Spirit not as a trophy to admire, but as a tool to use for His glory.

Take time today to honestly examine your heart and surrender any areas that need His healing touch.

### **Bible Verse**

'For I see that you are full of bitterness and captive to sin.' - Acts 8:23

### **Reflection Question**

What areas of your heart need to be brought to the cross for healing and transformation?

### **Quote**

When bitterness comes creeping at your door, you run to the cross. The wood of the cross applied to your situation will turn it sweet because the bitterness no longer grips your heart and pulls you away from the sweetness of Jesus.

### **Prayer**

Lord, search my heart and reveal any areas of bitterness, pride, or selfish ambition. I surrender these to You and ask for Your healing. Fill me with Your Holy Spirit and use me as a tool for Your glory, not as a trophy for my own. Transform my heart to be more like Yours. Amen.
